## **Merchant Educational Spotlight**

#### "What to Know When Buying Signs", Dawn's Sign Tech – Dawn Pease

- Look for an independent shop vs. Franchise
- Always obtain Certificates of Insurance for anyone going onto your property
- When checking around on prices make sure you are comparing apples to apples
- Most shops charge between \$65-\$100 /hr. This is reasonable and it depends on how much overhead the company employs.
- Don't discount the shop that doesn't have the lowest prices, he might have more to offer such as customer service. They are not out to be the cheapest, they are out to be the best.
- An honest shop will give you an honest opinion about other work brought to them. They will do this without being critical or verbally abusive towards the other shop.
- If you pay to have design work done, YOU OWN it. Ask for a copy of your artwork in every format available. Some shops will claim they have lost it because they don't want it going to a competitor, but you have every right to it.
- Do not allow anyone on your property that does not carry their own Workers Compensation.
- Be aware of zoning and bi laws, be aware of what is acceptable in your lease when renting property for your business.

• If there is lettering on your vehicle for business purposes, you MUST have a Commercial Plate.
